

Google Chrome users:


1. Open **Google Chrome**.
2. Navigate to <chrome://settings/cookies>.
3. **Uncheck** 'Block third-party cookies and site data' option.
4. or...
5. In the **Customized Behaviors** section, under **Sites that can always use cookies**, add [\[*\].structure.app](#).

Firefox users:

1. Open **Firefox**.
2. Navigate to <about:preferences#privacy>.
3. Under **Cookies and Site Data**, click **Manage Permissions...**
4. **Allow** access for <https://structure.app>.



Safari users:

1. Open **Safari**.
2. At the top-left, click **Safari** and choose **Preferences...**
3. In the dialog that opens, go to the **Privacy** tab.
4. Under **Cookies and website data**, uncheck **Block all cookies**.

There is no way to allow access only for specific websites in Safari, if you need more granular controls, please consider Google Chrome or Firefox.



Edge users:

1. Open **Microsoft Edge**.
2. Click on the **Settings and more** actions button on the toolbar and select **Settings**.
3. Open the **Privacy & security** tab.
4. Under **Cookies**, select **Don't block cookies** (default).
